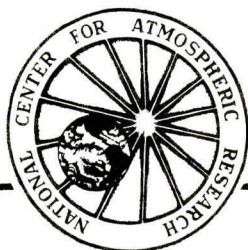

Lodge Receives ACS Award

Boulder, Colo. --- Dr. James P. Lodge, Jr., program scientist for atmospheric chemistry at the National Center for Atmospheric Research (NCAR), has received an award from the board of directors of the American Chemical Society (ACS) "in recognition of his significant and unique contributions to the study...of environmental improvement." The award was presented at the national American Chemical Society meeting in Houston, Texas, on February 22.

Dr. Lodge was cited for resourceful leadership as chairman of the Task Force Panel on Air and his contributions to the report, "Cleaning Our Environment -- The Chemical Basis for Action." This report makes specific recommendations for the control of air, water, refuse, and pesticide pollution in the total environment, especially from the chemical point of view.

Dr. Lodge received his Ph.D in chemistry from the University of Rochester. He came to NCAR in 1961 from Cincinnati, Ohio, where he headed the chemical research and development section at the Taft Sanitary Engineering Center of the U.S. Public Health Service.

Dr. Lodge has served on several ACS committees concerned with environmental problems, was a member of the Commission on Air Conservation of the American Association for the Advancement of Science, and is on the Colorado State Air Pollution Variance Board. He also holds an affiliate professorship in chemistry at Louisiana State University in Baton Rouge.
