

Boulder is most fortunate in being the site of the new National Center for Atmospheric Research. Passage of the blue-line amendment will be ~~our~~ a community expression of desire to have NCAR in Boulder. The amendment will not only give city water to the center but it will also give to the city a voice in the development of NCAR's physical plant.

If you favor the blue-line amendment and the addition to Boulder of this research institute, don't lose your chance to vote on January 31. In order to vote, you must be registered in the city books by January 24th. Go to the city clerk's office in the municipal building if you are not yet registered.

You are already registered if you voted at the last ^{city} council election in November 1959. But voting in Nov. 1960 at the presidential election does not automatically register you.

Registration for an absentee ballot ends on Jan. 21.

To find out if you are already registered, call the city clerk's office (H1 2-2020.)

NCAR means the addition to Boulder of a topflight research institute and the blue-line amendment guarantees city control of the development of its land.

Experience tells us that people who are against things bother to vote. The "Nos" usually have it. Not voting isn't very different from voting No. Make sure you have your say at the polls. Register to vote this week. And vote "Yes" on Jan. 31st.
