### High Altitude Observatory Visitor Appointments Available

Boulder, Colorado---The High Altitude Observatory (HAO) has announced the availability of visitor appointments for both new and established Ph.D. scientists interested in solar physics, solar-terrestrial physics, and related subjects.

The HAO is a division of the National Center for Atmospheric Research, which is operated by the University Corporation for Atmospheric Research, a non-profit consortium of universities, under sponsorship of the National Science Foundation.

Appointments for year-long stays and short-term visits are offered. One-year appointments usually begin in October, while visits of less than four months may begin at any time.

Each appointee will receive a salary equal to that from his or her home institution. New Ph.D.s will be given salaries commensurate with their qualifications and experience.

Applicants should submit a summary of education and work experience, a list of scientific publications, names and addresses of three or four scientific references, and a description of the work they propose to do during the visit. Applicants with less than two years of experience also should send a transcript of graduate-school grades and an abstract of the doctoral thesis.
