This summer's joint CSU-ESSA-NCAR hail research project will end this week when our people up at Raymer, in the high plains of northeast Colorado, dismantle their equipment and close up shop for the season.

This summer's joint project was an expansion of a hail research effort begun several years ago by CSU. It is the first phase of an extensive program aimed at learning enough about hailstorms so that we can eventually modify them and eliminate much of their destructive power. The National Science Foundation supported the project, which was coordinated by Guy Goyer of NCAR.

One week from this Sunday, KOA-TV (Channel 4) in Denver will present a report on the hail research project, put together by the KOA news staff. In the photograph above, Tom Watt of KOA is interviewing Guy Goyer at Raymer, while Bill Baker mans the camera. In addition to covering our work at Raymer, the KOA people flew with the ESSA and CSU researchers to film their airborne operations.
