## IRON IMAGES TO BE DISPLAYED AT NCAR

Boulder, CO---Scott C. Fredenburg is a Boulder metalsmith whose work in iron wall reliefs will be on exhibit at the National Center for Atmospheric Research (NCAR) from March 1 through March 31. The NCAR Gallery, on the second floor of the Mesa Laboratory at the west end of Table Mesa Drive, is open to visitors from 8 a.m. to 5 p.m. weekdays and from 9 a.m. to 3 p.m. weekends and holidays.

"During the last eight years I have cultivated my interest in metalsmithing to the refinements and exploration of iron," says the artist. "The search for new ways of handling iron, fire, and water has become a continuing challenge for me." His work ranges from jewelry, to Damascus knives, to iron wall reliefs, and reflects a diversity uncommon to the ordinary metalworker. His work is not only limited to a technique, a size, or function but is similarly concerned about the aesthetic form and social involvement that each new work will incorporate. He holds a M.F.A. degree from Southern Illinois University which is well known for its metals program.

His metal work has been recognized in many major exhibitions including a purchase award for the Illinois State Museum from the Illinois Crafts '81 show. Other distinguished exhibitions include the American Craft Museum in New York; The Cutting Edge a national exhibition, includes a two-year tour, and opened in Louisville, Kentucky; also the Blacksmithing: German 25/American 25 international invitational exhibition which will include a three-year touring schedule to at least two countries.
