**NCAR Issues Report on ENSO-Climate Change Workshop**

NCAR has just published a new 27-page report, ENSO-Climate Change Workshop. The report is the result of a workshop on the impacts of climate change and El Nino-Southern Oscillation (ENSO), held November 4-7 in Bangkok, Thailand.

Michael Glantz, program director of NCAR's Environmental and Societal Impacts Group (ESIG), organized and chaired the workshop, which was cosponsored by ESIG and the World Climate Impacts and Response Strategies Program of the United Nations Environment Programme. Other NCAR participants included Maria Krenz, workshop coordinator, and Gerald Meehl, Climate and Global Dynamics Division.

The purpose of the workshop was to identify and correct current speculation about how ENSO phenomena might be altered under the various global heating patterns produced in the earth's atmosphere with increased greenhouse gas concentrations.

Participants from Australia, Brazil, Chile, China, Indonesia, the Philippines, Thailand, Vietnam, and the United States represented various disciplines, reflecting the multidisciplinary nature of the problem and the multisectoral economic interest in ENSO forecasts.
