NCAR Scientists Present Papers for Fall American Geophysical Union Meeting

Six NCAR scientists have been invited to present professional papers at the American Geophysical Union (AGU) Fall Meeting in San Francisco, December 3–7, 1990. Thirty more NCAR scientists who have authored or coauthored papers will also present their work.

Guy Brasseur of the Atmospheric Chemistry Division (ACD), Gerald Meehl and Stephen Schneider of the Climate and Global Dynamics Division (CGD), Richard Fisher and Raymond Roble of the High Altitude Observatory (HAO), and Richard Dirks of the Mesoscale and Microscale Meteorology Division (MMM) are the invited six.

NCAR also will send three scientists to preside over AGU sessions: Barbara Emery (HAO), Equatorial lonosphere session; Rolando Garcia (ACD), Coupling Between Lower and Upper Atmosphere session; and John Gille (ACD), Stratospheric Chemistry II session.

AGU meeting attendees will be able to see the Scientific Computing Division's (SCD) exhibit promoting its graphics package and can also sample a variety of research subjects among NCAR presentations. This year's papers are on geomagnetic activity on the equatorial thermosphere; paleoclimatic modeling; the NASA Solar Physics program; the effect of increasing trace gases on middle atmosphere photochemistry; polar stratospheric cloud particles; and many other topics.
